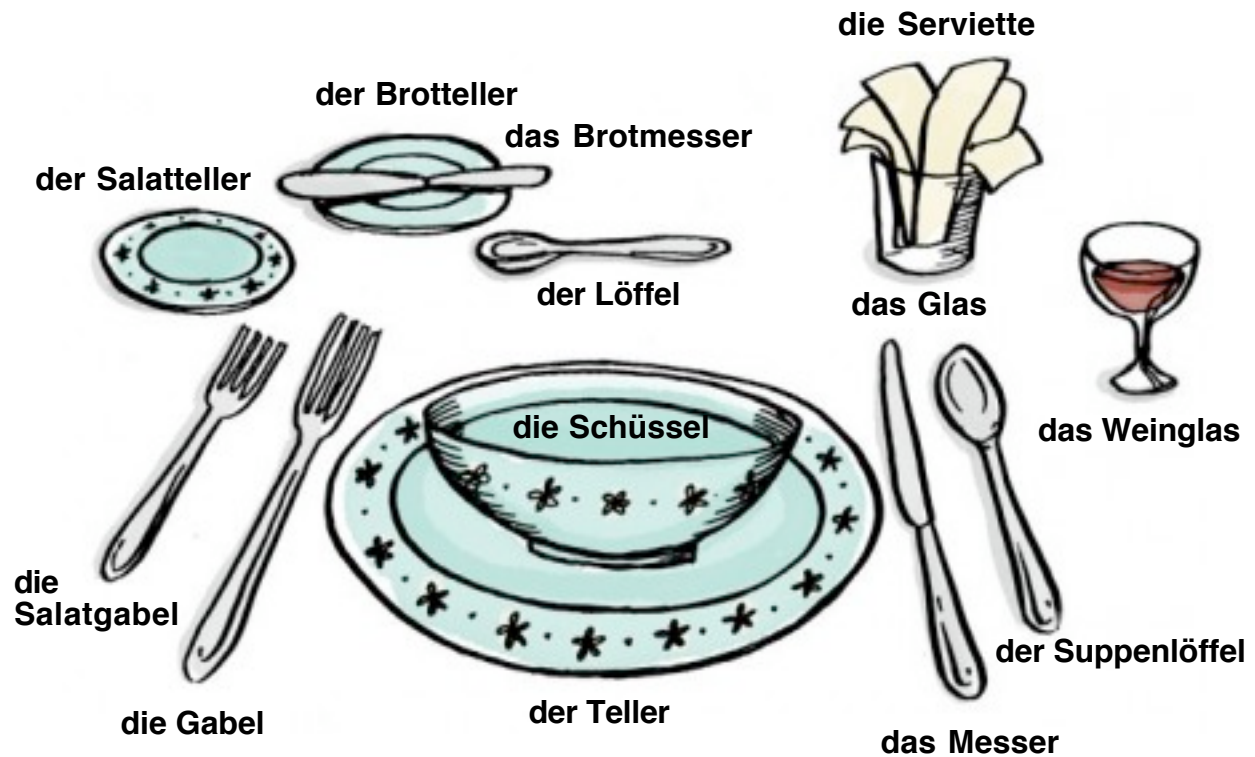

There are two past tense forms in German:  
Conversational past and narrative past.  
We will look at conversational past this semester.  
It is one of the most common forms of past tense,  
used mostly in spoken German.

helping verb:	past participle
hat (most common)	weak = ge+verb+t
ist (intransitive verbs) (= cannot take D.O.)	strong = ge+verb+en (the strong verb can change)
(most common: forward motion such as come, go, run, etc.)	mixed = ge+verb(change)+t
